SECTION 4. First-Aid Measures

FIRST AID - EYE CONTACT: Remove contact lenses if worn. Immediately flush eyes with water. Flush eyes with water for a minimum of 15 minutes, occasionally lifting and lowering upper lids. Get medical attention promptly.

FIRST AID - SKIN CONTACT: Immediately flush skin with plenty of water. Remove clothing. Get medical attention immediately. Wash clothing separately and clean shoes before reuse.

FIRST AID - INHALATION: Rescuers should put on appropriate protective gear. Remove from area of exposure. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Keep victim warm. Get immediate medical attention. To prevent aspiration, keep head below knees.

SECTION 5. Fire-Fighting Measures

UNUSUAL FIRE AND EXPLOSION HAZARDS: Flammable liquid and vapor. Vapors/dust may form explosive mixture with air. Empty containers retain product residue (liquid and/or vapor) and can be dangerous. DO NOT pressurize, cut, weld, braze, solder, drill, grind, or expose such containers to heat, flame, sparks, static electricity, or other sources of ignition. Also, do not reuse container without commercial cleaning or reconditioning. Closed container may explode under extreme heat. Can release vapors that form explosive mixtures at or above the flashpoint.

SPECIAL FIREFIGHTING PROCEDURES: As in any fire, wear self-contained breathing apparatus pressure-demand (MSHA/NIOSH approved or equivalent) and full protective gear. Water spray to cool containers or protect personnel. Use with caution. Avoid use of solid water streams. Water spray and foam must be applied carefully to avoid frothing. For large fires: Water fog, use fog to control vapors; For small fires: dry chemical, carbon dioxide, and foam.

HANDLING: Use only in a well ventilated area. Follow all SDS/label precautions even after containers are emptied because they may retain product residues. Ground and bond containers when transferring material. Use spark-proof tools and explosion proof equipment. Avoid contact with eyes, skin, and clothing. Avoid breathing vapor, fumes or mist. Take precautionary measures against static discharge.

STORAGE: Containers can build up pressure if exposed to heat (fire). Keep away from heat, sparks, and flame. Keep container closed when not in use. Protect from direct sunlight. Store containers in a cool, well ventilated place. Static Discharge, materials can accumulate static charges which can cause an incendiary electrical discharge. Material is a static accumulator which has the potential of forming ignitable vapor-air mixtures in storage tanks.
